OCT will be awarding scholarships to the two applicants who best meet or exceed the following requirements.

- The applicant must be a high school senior with a GPA of 2.5 or better.
- He/she must be attending an accredited college in the Fall of 2008 with a major or Minor in the Performing Arts (ex: Theater, Music, Dance, Theater production).
- The applicant must have theater experience (on stage or back stage) and must have been involved in at least one Oregon Community Theatre production (regular season or children's summer theatre).

Completed applications must be mailed to Oregon Community Theatre, P.O. Box 167547, Oregon, OH 46616. Applications must be postmarked by Feb.28, 2008. Awards will be announced in April and presented in May.
